2 Registration Information

Three ways to register

1. Mail-In Registration

- *Fill out the registration form. (Feel free to copy)
- *Identify class ID CODE as it is noted in the guide.
- *Mail-in registration begins December 12 for residents, non-residents may start mailing in forms December 19. Forms received after these dates will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Forms received prior to December 12 will be returned.
- *You must pay via cash or check when registering by mail.
- *Confirmation receipts will be mailed or emailed to confirm registration.
- *If a program is full, our office will notify you by phone and return your registration.

2. In-Person Registration

- *You are welcome to register in-person at our office located at City Hall, W240 N3065 Pewaukee Rd.
- *In-person registration will start December 12 at 8:00 a.m for residents, non-residents may start registering December 19.
- *Acceptable forms of payment in-person are cash, check, VISA, MasterCard or Discover.

3. Online Registration

- *You may register online starting December 12 at 8:00 a.m for residents, non-residents may register online starting December 19.
- *You must pay via credit card (VISA, MasterCard or Discover) when registering online.

The 2017 SPARK registration process is as follows:

Registration renewals for 2016 SPARK participants will be accepted March 1-10th. During this time, returning 2016 SPARK participants will be guaranteed registration for 2017 with payment/payment plan and proper forms and documents. *See below for more details.*

RENEWAL REGISTRATION CLOSES ON MARCH 10th at 4:00pm.

After this date, previous SPARK participants will no longer be guaranteed their spot in the program and must go into the lottery (below).

All other registrations accepted will be placed in a lottery pool to be drawn March 13th. Chosen registrants will be notified by email and must come in to the office for payment by March 17th. Absolutely NO EXCEPTIONS will be made. Any registrant that fails to make payment by March 17th will be removed from the program and the waitlist will be contacted to take the spot. The forms will be chosen by FAMILY; meaning if you have multiple children either all of them will get into the program or none. Children must reside at the same address to be considered a family.

NECESSARY FORMS WILL BE FILED

ELECTRONICALLY this year and will be sent to you via an email link; renewal registrations must have these forms completed by March 10th at 4:00 pm. Any new registrants will be given one week to complete these online forms after payment is accepted for the program. This link will be emailed in February to 2016 participants.


